VIII. EMPLOYEE UPDATES

A. PUBLIC WORKS

Public works director Tami Franklin reported to council on the updates surrounding the water meters getting changed out, road work getting done before speed bumps get placed on Elk Creek. The grader will not be ready in time, Secor will donate time with his grader and follow the city water truck on the streets. Rodeo grounds have had a walk through, a fence pole needs repaired and some painting. Samples have done, membranes have been delivered. She will call the Mag company to set up time to apply dust abatement after the streets get watered and graded. Everhart has been in contact with Idaho Rural water to get the yearly CCR report and found Paul Sifford had already asked for it to be done. He is the wastewater operator and should have left it to Kenny to enter into that agreement for the city's behalf. They will contact Paul and let him know. Everhart also mentioned that Troy Ashworth approached him about the water and sewer systems for the parcel he would like to annex in. Everhart explained he would need to go through the council and city and not directly to him, he cannot answer those types of questions on behalf of the city.

B. LAW ENFORCEMENT

Chief Otter has been in classes and was not present. Mayor Canody gave a report on the visitor's center office getting ready to open for the officers to use, body cameras will be here soon. Speed reader sign should be up and going soon. A new sign for the police department will be hanging up soon at the visitor's center. Everhart noticed building going on in his subdivision and it had not been permitted, thought maybe chief could find out what is going on.

C. CLERK/TREASURER'S OFFICE

Clerk Ptak updated the council on the upcoming audit, the clerk's office feels ready to move forward and hopefully it will go smoothly. There is a possibility the council will need to open the budget to allow for more spending in the street budget due to the grader repair work going over budget. The streets will still need to spend money to maintain roads, budget is tight. This will be good timing with the audit and budget prep for next year. Water bills have gone out with the exception of just a couple, they are all reading accurately and have been easy to find leaks or just heavy usage during the winter, a few might take some time to catch up due to overestimating during the winter. The report for council has not been updated yet due to the winter reading and adjustments getting done to bring everyone up to date.

Dan Meyer from the Jack Pine Round Up reported to the council regarding the clean up and repairs they plan on doing to the rodeo grounds July 17th, 2021 this includes painting, mending and clean-up of the arena and grounds, with no cost to the city. Some dirt and rock removal to make more room for vendors, they will call dig line before they proceed. Everhart made a motion to allow the Jack Pine Round-Up committee to remove rocks and do dirt work with the approval and supervision of public works, seconded by Martin. 3 ayes

2. IDAHO CITY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT – 4TH OF JULY PARADE

Mitchell Tain addressed the council about the 4th od July parade, nothing has changed from the previous years, chief Otter has no objections. Secor made a motion to approve the Idaho City Fire Protection District 4th of July Parade, seconded by Everhart. 3 ayes.

- 3. POSSIBLE CANCELATION OF OFF-ROAD STAMPEDE THE GO AGENCY Chief Otter addressed the council and stated that the issues of EMT and Law Enforcement had been handled right before the meeting. Melissa Potts from East Boise County Ambulance District addressed the council and gave an update on what had transpired and the concerns of only having one vehicle available for the weekend. The Go Agency has hired a private service and will use EBCAD for transport only and only if it is available. They were not contacted until this week and did not have the time required to draw up a contract. Future events will need to have better preparation. Last minute crew has been provided for the area, not strictly for the event, but for the community. They will be there if needed and if they are available. She has asked if they can be added to the event checklist so they can be notified. Clerk Ptak will add it to the event checklist so everyone in the city will be aware of what is happening where and when. Council feels everything has been addressed, and it had been approved at a prior meeting so no action required, all conditions have been met.

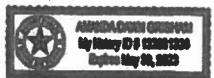
