MINUTES

CALL MEETING TO ORDER: Mayor Canody called the meeting to order at 6:04 pm

ROLL CALL: Secor, Martin present. Hillyard by phone. Everhart absent. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Secor led the pledge of allegiance.

II. PUBLIC HEARINGS

Items listed as public hearings allow citizen comment on the subject matter before the Council. Residents or visitors wishing to comment upon the item before the Council should follow the procedural steps. In order to testify, individuals must sign up in advance, providing sufficient information to allow the Clerk to properly record their testimony in the official record of the City Council. Hearing procedures call for presentation by the applicant, submission of information from City staff, followed by public testimony.

III. ENGINEER'S REPORT

Kasey Ketterling from TO Engineers reported that the preliminary engineering report for the infiltration gallery project was approved 10/23/18 by IDEQ. The plans and specifications are still under review. USDA funding office is still reviewing the city's request for funding on this project.

The water plant project for the reverse osmosis pilot test completion report is still weeks away from being delivered by Tonka. An approval from DEQ of the pilot test results is required before a contract can be given to Tonka for the final equipment procurement.

IDEQ has waived the sand turbidity test, and Cascade will be ready to start work soon. A notice will be issued when the city has signed the sand replacement contract for sand bay #3.

A. IDAHO CITY READER BOARD

It was brought to the city's attention that the school no longer wishes to be in charge of the reader board outside of town. It is currently not working and the cost to the school district is justified. Laura Shields broke down the cost to repair and yearly maintenance. The city decided they do not want to be in control of it. The additional cost to the city would be a burden on the tax payers for something that is outside of city limits. It was suggested that maybe the Chamber or someone else may be interested.

B. SEWER HOOKUP ISSUES AT 110 COTTONWOOD – MARK & LAURINDA RICE Mark Rice presented his sewer issue to the council and it was determined to be an issue between the two property owners.
