A. CITY HALL UPSTAIRS HEATING & COOLING UNIT REPLACEMENT PROPOSAL FROM YMC

Clerk Ptak informed council that because it is so early in the fiscal year and the budget does not allow for that big of an expenditure for City Hall, Ptak had asked YMC if the units could be repaired to get by for now. Discussion on the pricing and options ensued. Counselor Elliott question how much the repair might be, and Ptak responded, typically a couple thousand. Counselor Heffington suggested waiting because new equipment will be coming out after the first of the year which will allow for different potential options. Mayor and Council decided to wait on unit replacement.

Mayor Everhart explained that the Public Works and Law Enforcement updates will be once a month at the second meeting of the month.

Clerk Ptak informed council that the routine for 7 day and 24-hour notices is being tightened up because the money from water/sewer bills is what goes to paying the water system loan (i.e. the \$40,000 check that was just approved). There were a couple of customers shut off today. Council and Mayor may get feedback from the community.

D. CITY ATTORNEY

City Attorney Callahan has not received any response from Element Construction on the overdue utility bills. Callahan has been sending emails with no response and will send a letter to the physical address. Next week on Wednesday, Callahan will be up to work with the Historic Commission on open meeting law training.

IX. COUNCIL UPDATES

Counselor Secor addressed Dax Olvera with Parks and Rec to allow him to provide an update. Olvera explained that last Saturday the old shed was moved to the back side to allow for easier access to the equipment. Parks and Rec received their dirt delivery and Olvera thanked Clerk Ptak for getting it set up. Olvera added that the only thing they needed to spend money on was blocks. Olvera had a receipt for that purchase and questioned how to be reimbursed, Secor responded to give the information to Goodlett. Olvera has a meeting on Monday to see what is needed to move forward on the BLM lease. Counselor Secor added that he has been in touch with Todd Wernex at the Idaho Department of Lands, and they explained that there is no lease for Steamboat this year or the foreseeable future. Wernex talked with Secor about him personally leasing but Secor does not have the time. Secor suggested Parks and Rec taking over the lease to provide income for their department. Discussion on the cost and management ensued. Carrie Ann Kowalczyk explained that Mores Creek Recreation used to run the sledding hill but ran into issues with funding. Mayor Everhart suggested a potential collaboration with Parks and Rec and Mores Creek Recreation Foundation. Discussion on funding and manning the lease ensued. Secor added that he will ask Wernex to email the contract to allow them to look it over.

XI. CITIZEN COMMENTS

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Rose Adams informed council that the potholes on Bear Run are quite bad and because most of the traffic is from Duquette, why don't they help with repairs. Mayor Everhart explained that Bear Run was on the list for repair, but the city ran out of funds to get it taken care of. If something isn't figured out by next spring it will go back to dirt and gravel. Mayor Everhart further explained that the other portion of the road beyond city limits is the County's responsibility and would need to be brought up to the County road department.

Carrie Ann Kowalczyk added that she understands the situation with water bills and not receiving payment. If there is no communication or attempt to reconcile the account, Kowalczyk supports the city in shutting off water for no payment. Kowalczyk apologized for the city being put in that situation as she is sure it is not fun.




